# **Euclid Municipal Court**

Euclid Municipal Court is a single jurisdiction Court serving the City of Euclid.

The Court is located at 555 East 222<sup>nd</sup> Street, in Euclid, Ohio.

At the direction of Administrative/Presiding Judge Patrick J. Gallagher, the 2021 Euclid Municipal Court staff included one part-time Magistrate; two full-time Magistrates: a Chief Probation Officer and two Probation Officers; a Clerk of Courts and three Division Chief Deputies, ten Deputy Clerks, two Bailiffs, and six part-time Court Security Officers.

Euclid Municipal Court has two Divisions:

- Civil/Small Claims Division consists of civil actions with the statutory monetary limit of \$15,000 and small claims actions with a statutory limit of \$6,000.
- Criminal/Traffic Division consists of the handling of initial appearance hearings of felony cases, criminal misdemeanor cases, and traffic citations issued by the Euclid Police Department, Ohio State Highway Patrol, Cleveland Metroparks Police Department, Cuyahoga County Sheriff, and the Cleveland Clinic Police Department.

## **Euclid Municipal Court** **2021 Highlights**

### **Right To Counsel in Eviction Actions**

In concert with the efforts of City Council, the Court - in July, 2021 – began participating with The Legal Aid Society’s program to provide a Right-To-Counsel to tenants’ in eviction actions. On a weekly basis, the Court provides the Legal Aid Society (“Legal Aid”) with a list of all eviction cases filed in our Court. Legal Aid then sends information to the tenants about the legal assistance program. The Court also mails with the Summons and Complaint a handbill explaining that the tenant may be eligible for free legal assistance and providing contact information for the Legal Aid Society and United Way.

For tenants, this program may stop evictions by asserting valid legal defenses, get tenants additional time to move, protect tenants’ property, reduce or avoid liabilities, address unit repairs and apply for rental assistance. For landlords, this program may streamline proceedings where there is no valid legal defense, provide a negotiated resolution, protect landlords’ property and facilitate payment to the landlord through tenants’ rental assistance programs.

By providing access to legal counsel, this program promotes public confidence in the judiciary. This improves the litigants' perceptions of the fairness of the judicial system and thereby promotes the community's confidence in the outcomes of the judicial system.

### **Community Outreach**

Due to COVID, we were limited in our community outreach efforts. However, the Court was able to expand existing programs.

### **First Offenders Program**

The number of participants in the Court's First Offender Program more than doubled from the previous year. Under this Program, the defendant must obviously be a first offender and must complete community service hours, counseling programs, undergo drug and alcohol testing and treatment (if necessary), obtain employment, and not engage in any criminal conduct. If defendant successfully completes all requirements, the charges are dismissed and defendant's record is sealed. This program has huge implications and benefits – especially for young people

### **Expungements**

The number of participants in the Court's Expungement Program almost doubled from the previous year. At sentencing, we actively and intentionally advise Defendants that they will be eligible for expungement upon completion of their sentence. We also identify individuals who previously completed their sentences and may be eligible for expungement. That information is provided to Legal Clinics which then provide information and assistance to those individuals.

### **Computerization**

In December, 2020, City Council authorized the purchase of Pioneer Benchmark Case Management System. Once operational, this new case management system will provide electronic filing, on-line access to imaged documents, remote access by Court personnel, calendaring, in-court processing, email and text message notification to attorneys and parties. These functions will directly impact the Court's efficiency, user-access and transparency. We expect the new case management system to go live this year.

In May, 2021, City Council authorized the Court to enter into a contract with an IT provider. Our new provider now host, maintain and secure our data and information on external servers, maintain workstations, implement and maintain remote access. In addition, the Court now has Wi-Fi service.

## Website

In May, 2021, the Court received a grant from the Ohio Supreme Court of \$35,100.00 for a Court website. A dedicated Court website will allow the Court to better communicate with members of the public, allow members of the public to transact business with the Court and improve the Court's transparency. We expect to go live with the Website by May, 2022.

## Euclid Municipal Court Probation Department

The Euclid Municipal Court Probation Department is staffed with two (2) full-time Probation Officers and a Chief Probation Officer who monitors all defendants who have been sentenced to a term of community control or Diversion. Together all Officers are currently managing approximately 371 active cases as of 03/26/2021. The Probation Department is responsible for conducting investigations for Pre-Sentence Hearings, First Offender (Diversion) Referrals, Supervising Defendants that are court ordered to complete a term of Community Control and conditions along with completing Expungement request and any additional referrals and request. The Euclid Probation Department is here to ensure that Court ordered conditions are satisfied and that the rules of probation are abided by until the term of probation is complete or terminated.

We (the Probation Department) are working diligently to assist with the safety of the community, the rehabilitation of the offenders that are referred and or assigned to the Probation Department and improving public confidence in justice by treating everyone with procedural fairness.

The Euclid Municipal Court is working to incorporate alternative sentencing recommendations such as community service, house arrest monitoring, treatment and prevention programs etc., in lieu of the traditional jail sentencing, court cost and fines to ensure that the defendants that receive any form of sentencing have the means to successfully fulfill their court obligations. During Covid the Probation Department utilized alternative appointment reporting options such as reporting by phone, email and zoom to limit the foot traffic coming in and out of the Euclid Municipal Court building for safety precautions.
